## **Stream Alteration Permit**

This is a letter I received about culverts or bridges over the streams from the Utah Division of Water Rights, please read and follow the instructions for the permit. After getting the permit please send a copy with your site plan and checklist to the Environmental Board Member to get approval from the association.

For work that would alter a natural stream channel, the property owner would need to obtain a stream alteration permit from our office prior to construction. Blank applications can be found on our website here:

Processing takes between 20 to 30 days. Generally, the permit issued will contain conditions of approval.
